**NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION**

**Description of the Incident:**

Pet flew St. Louis to Houston and then connected from Houston to Seattle. Upon arrival into Seattle, it was found deceased.

**Description of the Cause of the Incident:**

According to necropsy results from the Washington Animal Disease Diagnostic Laboratory, they found a “small amount of shredded newspaper partially obstruct[ing] the opening of the larynx.” Also it states, “the lodging of a significant amount of newspaper at this location (larynx) as in this case could have led to blocked airflow, hypoxia and death due to respiratory failure”.

**Description of any corrective action taken:**

None, as this death was not related to Continental Airlines’ handling.
